2. Mayor Morrissey requested a moment of silence to reflect upon the ten year anniversary of the September 11th catastrophe that faced our nation and remember all the emergency responders and victims who died that day.

The Legal Director shall prepare the appropriate ordinance. LAID OVER.

OFFICERS REPORTS

15. Mayor Morrissey presented a Proclamation proclaiming the month of September, 2011 to be "NATIONAL ALCOHOL AND DRUG ADDICTION RECOVERY MONTH" in Rockford, Illinois and urged all citizens to support this year's theme, "Join the Voices" for Recovery; Recovery Benefits Everyone".
16. Mayor Morrissey announced the 2012 Community Development Annual Action Plan presentation will be held on September 7th at 12:00 (noon) and September 8th at 5:30 pm at the Northwest Community Center, 1325 N. Johnston Avenue. He encouraged everyone to attend and share their ideas.
17. Mayor Morrissey mentioned Winnebago County Emergency Responders are sponsoring an event in remembrance of the 10th anniversary of 9/11 on September 11th at 8:00 am at 650 West State Street.
18. Mayor Morrissey congratulated the Rockford Fire Department for being awarded Accreditation Agency Status by the Commission of Fire Accreditation International (CFAI) in Atlanta Georgia on August 24, 2011. He invited Chief Bergsten and members of the accreditation team forward to receive recognition for their efforts.

Chief Bergsten reported one in only 148 agencies worldwide achieve Accredited Agency Status. He commended the entire Rockford Fire Department for their role in achieving this award culminating a four-year effort. He recognized Henrietta Dotson-Williams and LoRayne Logan, members of the Board of Fire and Police Commission, and thanked Mayor Morrissey, Alderman Bill Robertson, city staff and administration for their support through this process.

19. Mayor Morrissey mentioned the next budget retreat will be Saturday, September 10th at 9:00 am in Council Chambers.
20. Mayor Morrissey reported the dance team Fatally Unique unfortunately did not make it to the finals on the program "Americans Got Talent" but thanked them for being great ambassadors for the City of Rockford and wished them future success.
21. Alderman Beach reported a very hazardous incident near East State Street and Oak Knolls concerning a downed power line and gas leak. He requested a meeting with ComEd and Nicor representatives concerning this incident.

Mayor Morrissey advised Fire Chief Bergsten will coordinate a response from ComEd and Nicor concerning this particular incident.

Fire Chief Bergsten reported he had received responses from both utility companies and they indicated this was a very rare isolated occurrence.

Mayor Morrissey suggested future discussion in either committee or another appropriate venue.

22. Alderman Mark also reported on Saturday the North Main and Auburn area lost power from the incident that occurred at East State Street and Oak Knolls. This is the sixth time that area has lost power and he again requested a meeting with ComEd representatives.
23. Mayor Morrissey mentioned ComEd has proposed the Smart Grid legislation which promises newer technology but with an automatic rate increase to customers. Governor Quinn will more than likely veto the controversial legislation headed for a vote in Springfield. He advised he will continue to follow up on this issue.
24. Alderman Jacobson commended the efforts of the Waterfront committee, City staff and volunteers for another successful Waterfront Festival celebration.
25. Alderman McNeely also encouraged everyone to attend the 2012 Community Development Annual Action Plan presentation will be held on September 7th at 12:00 (noon) and September 8th at 5:30 pm at the Northwest Community Center, 1325 N. Johnston Avenue.
26. Alderman McNeely recognized former Alderman Victory Bell in attendance at tonight's meeting.
27. Alderman McNeely commended the Rockford Fire Department for achieving Accreditation Agency Status and expressed concern with jeopardizing that recognition with our challenging budget.
28. Alderman McNeely also congratulated the dance team Fatally Unique on their accomplishment and wished them the best of luck.
29. Alderman McNeely mentioned receiving several phone calls from her constituents concerning problems with residential water and requested the residents of that area be notified or have city staff make a presentation on the water system.

Alderman Thompson-Kelly informed Alderman McNeely the water problem was with well water and not the city water system. She also advised there have been two public meetings with a third meeting to be scheduled. Any questions or concerns may be directed to Angela Goral, Winnebago County Board member.

Mayor Morrissey suggested Tim Holdeman, Public Works Water Superintendent, provide an update on the water system improvements at an upcoming council meeting.

30. Alderman Jacobson also thanked members of the community for attending the Labor Day Parade and supporting our workers.
33. Alderman Wasco reiterated Alderman Jacobson's comments about the parade and was happy to be a part of the celebration.

34. Mayor Morrissey called attention to the Memorandum designating City Administrator James R. Ryan, to sign all ordinances, resolutions, contracts and applications requiring the Mayor's signature during his absence.
