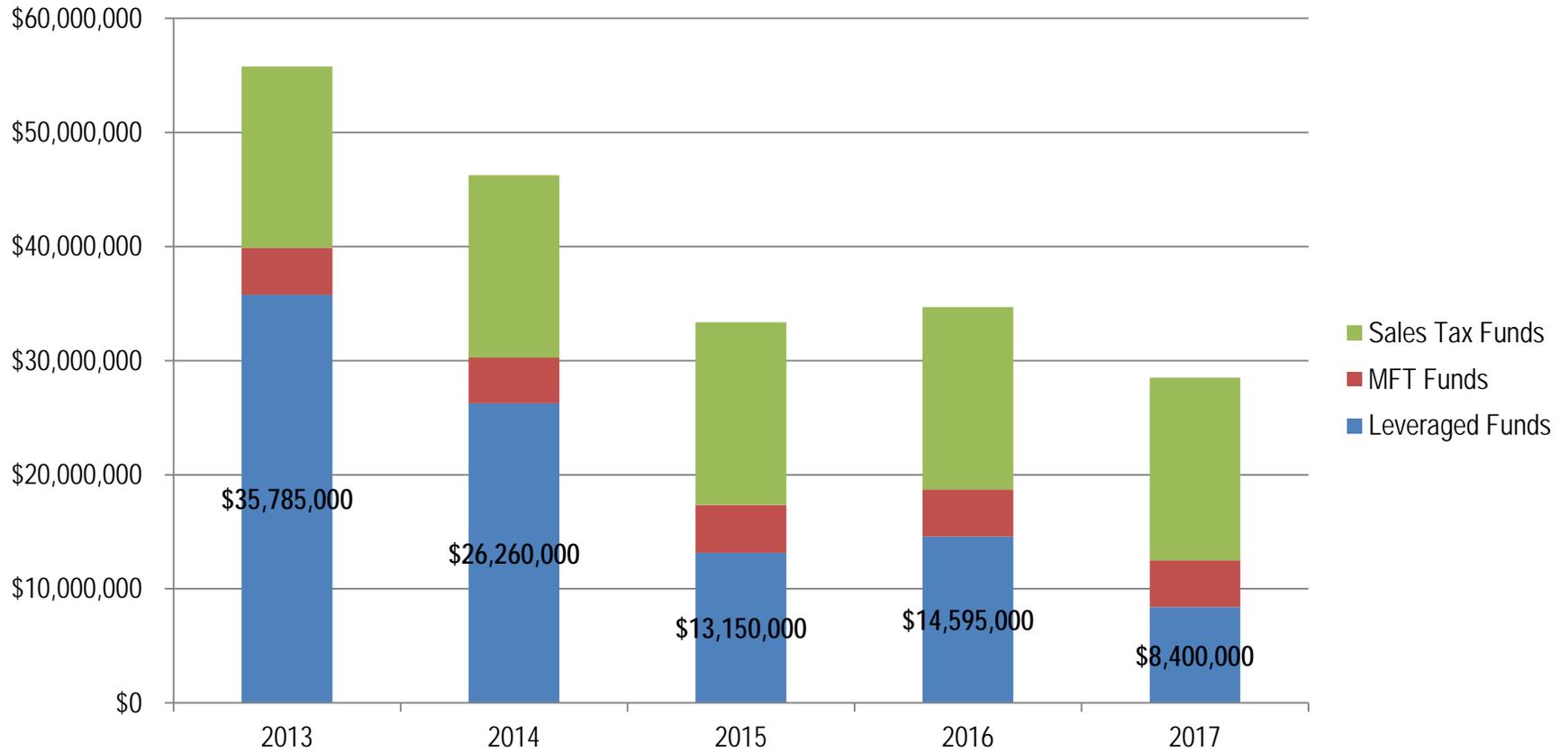

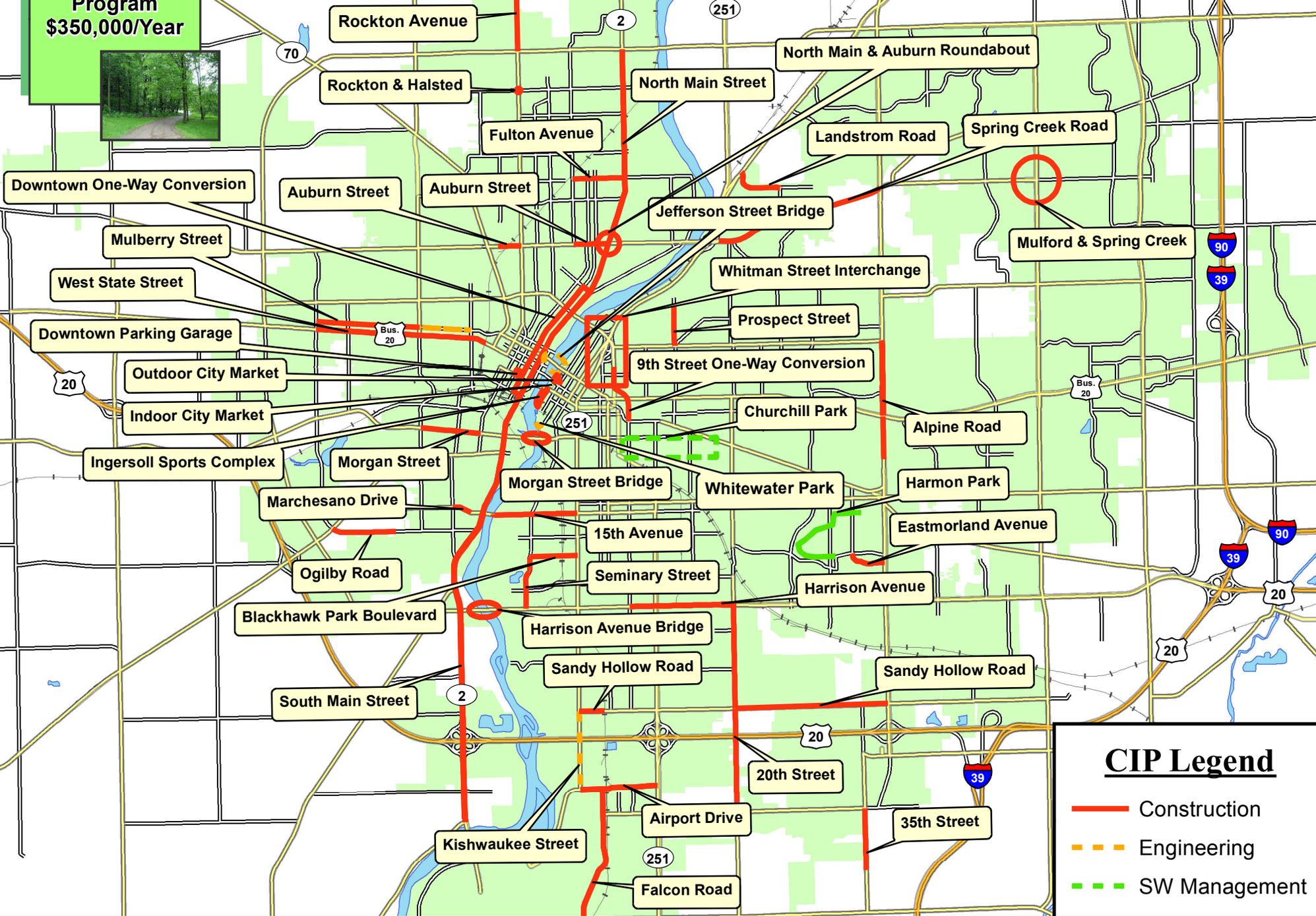

Historically, the City of Rockford, also known as the Forest City, has not successfully implemented a defined protocol to manage a tree replanting program to offset the numerous City tree removals that are undertaken each year. In order to establish this protocol, we must first assess our tree resources, what they provide to our community, implement a replanting plan to address the significant losses in our tree canopy and provide an adequate budget to support tree plantings city-wide. The following is a synopsis of where we are, where we need to be and how we can promote positive outcomes as it relates to the City's Urban Canopy.

- Team Issues – The recently completed City-Wide tree inventory identified the volume of City-owned trees (within the right-of-way, and other City owned property) of varying species stands at 50,625. However, the combination of the City's aging tree canopy and minimal efforts over the past two decades to promote new tree plantings is causing the overall health of City owned trees to decline. Over the past 10 years Forestry crews and contractors have removed an average of 435 trees each year with the average over the past five (5) years rising to 569 per year (20% increase). In 2011 a total of 825 City-owned trees were removed and that number is projected to climb to approximately 1,200 trees per year over the next seven (7) years, the majority being 1,000 ash tree removals per year due to the EAB crisis. This will significantly affect our carbon footprint relating to greenhouse gasses, utility bills, and increase the amount of storm water introduced into the drainage system.
- Proposed Actions – Having learned from previous reforestation efforts undertaken 40 years ago in response to the Dutch Elm disease, whereby the response was to replant predominantly maple, ash and locust trees, the Forestry Department is moving forward with an emphasis on tree diversity and limiting the number of like species in close proximity to each other. This will mitigate a widespread impact on any one area within the City as well as the overall impact on the entire tree canopy should another pest such as EAB appear in the future. It is also imperative we implement an aggressive plan to monitor and replace trees within the various business districts. In commercial downtown environments, trees planted in sidewalk "tree pits" should be removed and replaced every 10 to 12 years. Beyond that threshold, these trees begin to lift sidewalks, affect buried

utilities and become increasingly expensive to remove should they fail as a result of a windstorm or die.

In response to the EAB crisis, the Forestry Department is mandating a two-fold program of removal and treatment. Of the 8,000+ ash trees in the City inventory, most of them will be removed over a period of 5 to 7 years. Additionally, the treatment program, which is in its first full year and has treated 529 ash trees to date, will identify another 300 trees in 2013 to attain a goal of 10% of City owned ash under treatment for EAB. Preliminary results from this program are positive as we have witnessed nearly dead ash trees in close proximity to healthy trees which were treated in 2011. 2012 has marked the first year in a decade that much higher numbers of new trees are being planted other than those associated with major roadway projects. 228 new trees will have been planted in the neighborhoods and Central Business District before the end of 2012. Although still not sufficient to meet our needs due to budgetary constraints (1:1 removal/replant ratio is minimally acceptable), it is a marked improvement over the 30 to 50 trees per year planted in previous years. Ultimately, it is imperative the City collaborate and form partnerships with outside public/private agencies in order to provide funding to attain an acceptable level of tree replacement.

- Integration of Actions Within CIP and Street Division Programs – The Forestry Section of the Street Division oversees all maintenance performed on City owned trees to include pruning, removals, replanting, pesticide treatments and emergency response to partial or full tree failures (i.e. weather related damage). Tree pruning and pesticide treatment is primarily an internal function utilizing City employees, while removal and replanting is relegated to contractors for the most part. City crews prune an average of 2,500 trees per year and treat an average of 400 trees per year for EAB, chlorosis and oak wilt. Over the next 7 years, contractors will remove an average of 1,200 trees per year at a cost of \$720,000 per year charged to the Sanitation Fund. Reforestation efforts will focus on the neighborhood streets rather than gateway streets which will have corridor plans incorporated into the construction phase as they are rebuilt (past & future examples include Kishwaukee, South Main and West State Street). In 2012, neighborhood replanting will be funded by \$50,000 allocated within CIP and a \$14,000 grant obtained thru the Metropolitan Mayor’s Caucus, however this will only allow the city to plant 228 new trees; far below the number of removals. In order to attain 1:1 ratio of removal to replant, combined funding sources must meet a minimum threshold of \$360,000 per year (1,200 trees @ \$300 per tree) over the next 7 years (\$2,520,000 total). CIP funding will remain at its current level of \$50,000 per year with the goal of increasing that amount to \$75,000 by 2017. Sanitation Fund allocations currently allow for minimal tree plantings. It is proposed that the remaining funding be incorporated as a part of each Alderman’s Ward program. This would amount to approximately \$25,000 per ward (i.e. roughly ½ block of repaving) and would allow the City to sustain the City’s tree canopy at the current level.
- Program Management – As the City’s Forestry Program and reforestation efforts move forward, program management will be crucial in order to sustain our current efforts for generations to come. Tree planting and maintenance priorities will be based on need as follows:

- Short term – address areas most impacted by EAB
- Long term – other areas in need of species diversification or reforestation as mature trees begin to decline.
- Continue to monitor major reconstruction projects to incorporate sustainable features, thus requiring minimal routine maintenance while still meeting or exceeding City design standards.
- Develop and approve a tree replacement ordinance.
- Maximize grant opportunities by developing an aggressive tree management program.
- Nurture partnerships with other agencies (County, Park District, County Forest Preserve, etc.) to leverage additional funding opportunities and promote cost savings and maintenance programs.

Re: Development of New Parking Deck Structure
Southeast Corner of Church and Chestnut

Overview

The existing post tension parking structure, referred to as the Concourse Deck, located near the intersection of Church Street and Chestnut Street was built in 1976 and provides parking for many downtown business and attractions, including the Winnebago County Courthouse and Administration Building, the new Federal Courthouse, the BMO Harris Bank Center (BMO Center) and various business in the central city. The deck contains 843 spaces and generates approximately \$226,000 a year in permit fees, and \$104,000 per year in hourly parking fees. Currently, approximately 475 spaces are closed due to deterioration of the deck structure. An evaluation of the facility indicates that the value of potential repairs will likely outweigh the useful life of the deck. Based on this factor, City staff is recommending the construction of a new parking deck that will provide a better return on investment. Additionally, the continued revitalization of the downtown core depends, in some part to providing additional parking within this strategic corridor. A parking study completed in 2008 corroborates the need for more public parking in the southwest quadrant of downtown.

In the short term, the City intends to keep the portion of the Concourse Deck open while pursuing the design and construction of a new parking deck structure at the southeast corner of Church Street and Chestnut Street. This location provides direct access to the BMO Harris Center, and will improve parking availability to Davis Festival Park, the Federal Courthouse, and could in some cases; assist in overflow parking for the Ingersoll Sports Complex currently under development. The re-development of the North Main / South Main corridor through the removal of the former pedestrian mall and construction of the Downtown Streetscape project has also improved the retail prospects of this shopping and entertainment district. The proposed new deck sits within immediate proximity of this area.

It is also important to consider the possibility of developing leasable space within the new deck structure. It's location within the downtown retail and entertainment district, as well as the governmental centers located in the immediate proximity, makes it a candidate for valuable leasable space. Some of the initial designs discussed internally would consider the inclusion of a drive-through lane that would allow for a fast food or coffee service tenant. The need for a new structure and downtown parking capacity, and the emergence of the downtown as a commercial and public space create a design environment for the structure that provides exciting possibilities.

New Deck Design & Construction Process

Upon approval from the City Council to move forward with the deck development project, we would be seeking a design to develop concepts and preliminary cost estimates for decks with approximately 650 spaces and options for retail/office space on the ground floor. Additionally, the planned parking deck should allow for future expansion to approximately 950 spaces. Concepts would include preliminary building elevations, preliminary cost, and preliminary parking layout and vehicle circulation. Concepts would also include layout of remaining lot after Concourse Deck is removed.

The design consultant team would also be required to facilitate a series of public meetings with project stakeholders. The meeting would include discussion of analyzed alternatives and input from public agencies, local stakeholders, downtown businesses and local citizens. Meeting attendees would include at a minimum, City of Rockford (including all City Council members), Winnebago County, Rockford Area Conventions and Visitor's Bureau (RACVB), Rockford Area Economic Development Council, River District, Rock River Development Partnership (RRDP), and BMO Harris Center/RAVE Board. The ultimate goal of the meetings will be to show stakeholder alternatives, including building elevations and gather comments and seek public consent for a final alternative.

City staff anticipates that the design process will require approximately one year to complete. Throughout the design process, staff and the design team will also be working through land acquisition, investigation into all subsurface and overhead utility issues, geotechnical investigations, and negotiations with the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) for ingress/egress permits. This would provide a construction target of 2014 and would likely take the entire construction season and possibly that of at least a portion of 2015.

New Deck Construction Cost

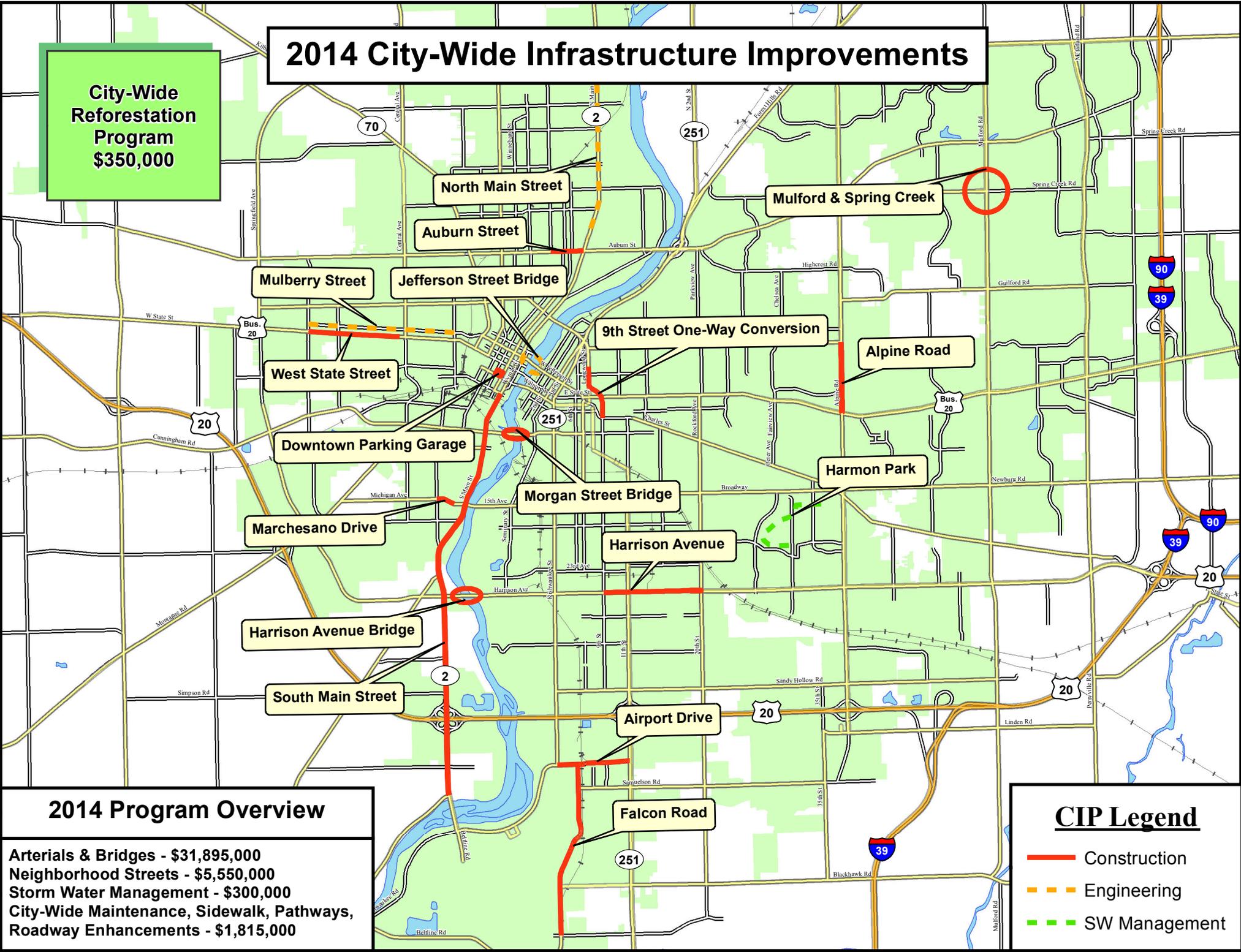
The rule of thumb for parking deck development is construction typically ranges from \$18,000/space to \$20,000/space depending on how much commercial space may be included in the final design. In this case, using the more conservative amount of \$20,000 per space, and including costs for land acquisition, design, and other possible construction factors, City staff is estimating that a new structure could range from \$15,000,000 to \$18,000,000. Conceptual design will be required to provide a specific target funding level that will be required. The financing package required for the effort will consist of a combination of general obligation bonds and revenue through the parking fund.

We look forward to working with the City Council, and the community stakeholders to design and construct a long-term community asset that will continue to support the existing and emerging success of the downtown core. Please feel free to contact me
